Key actors from SNA

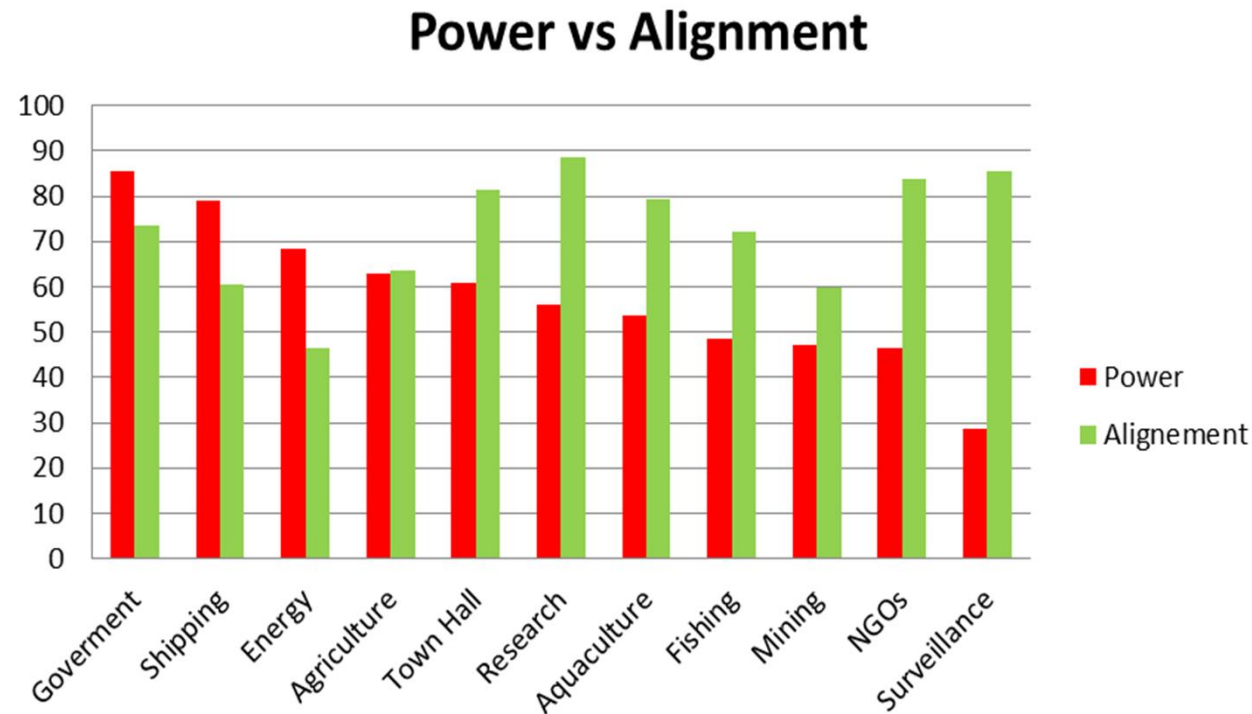
Centrality measures address the question: "Who is the most important or central actor in this network?"

- 1) **Degree:** Degree is simply the number of links of each node (in and out: In-degree and out-degree)
- 2) **Betweenness:** quantifies the number of times a node acts as a bridge along the shortest path between two other nodes.
- 3) **Closeness:** Closeness indicates how close a node is to the rest of the network. Represents the ability of a node to reach the others

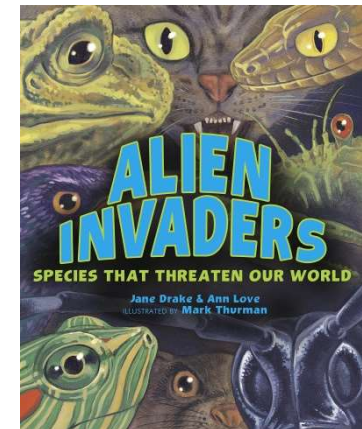

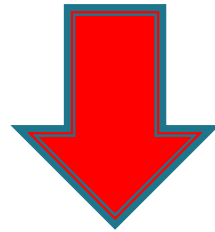

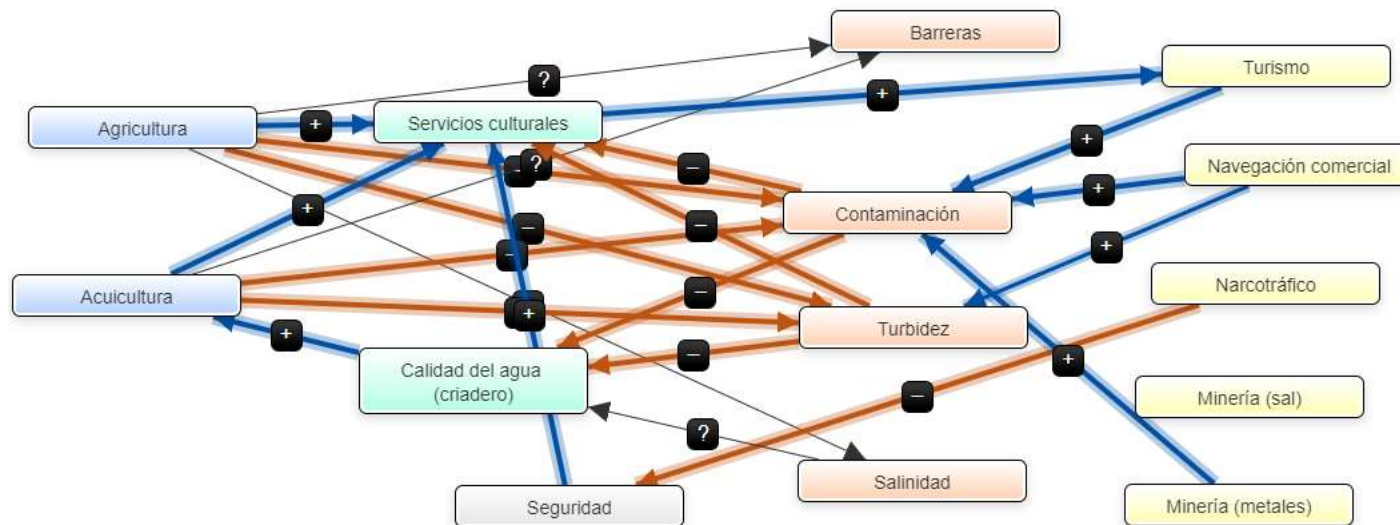

What is conceptual modelling?



A conceptual model is a representation of a system, made up of the composition of concepts that are used to help people know, understand, or simulate a topic that the model represents, including the important entities and the relationships between them.

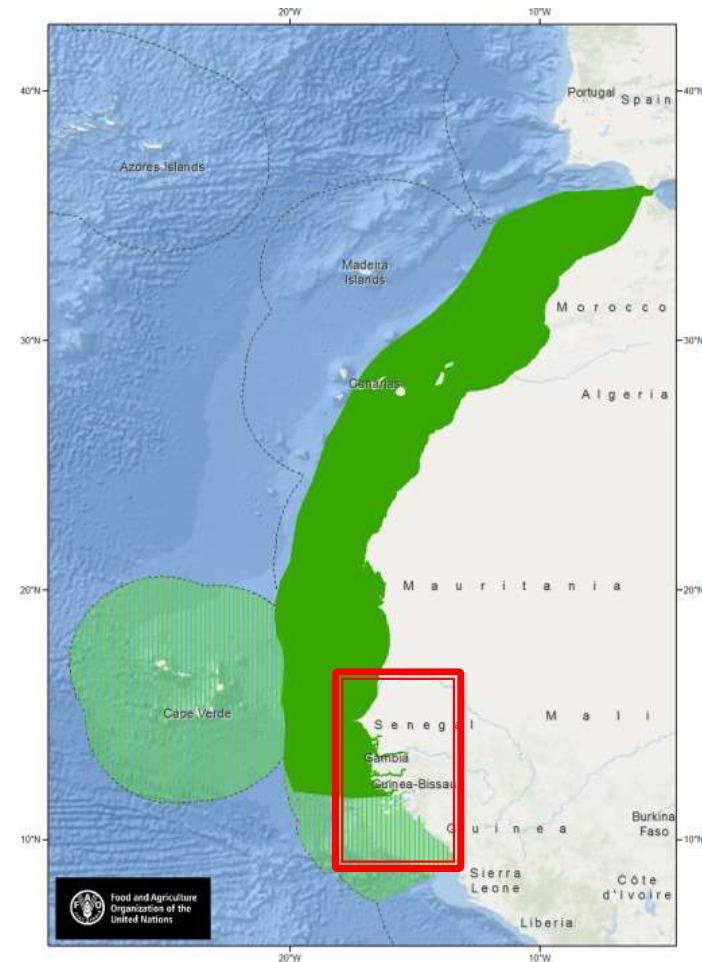

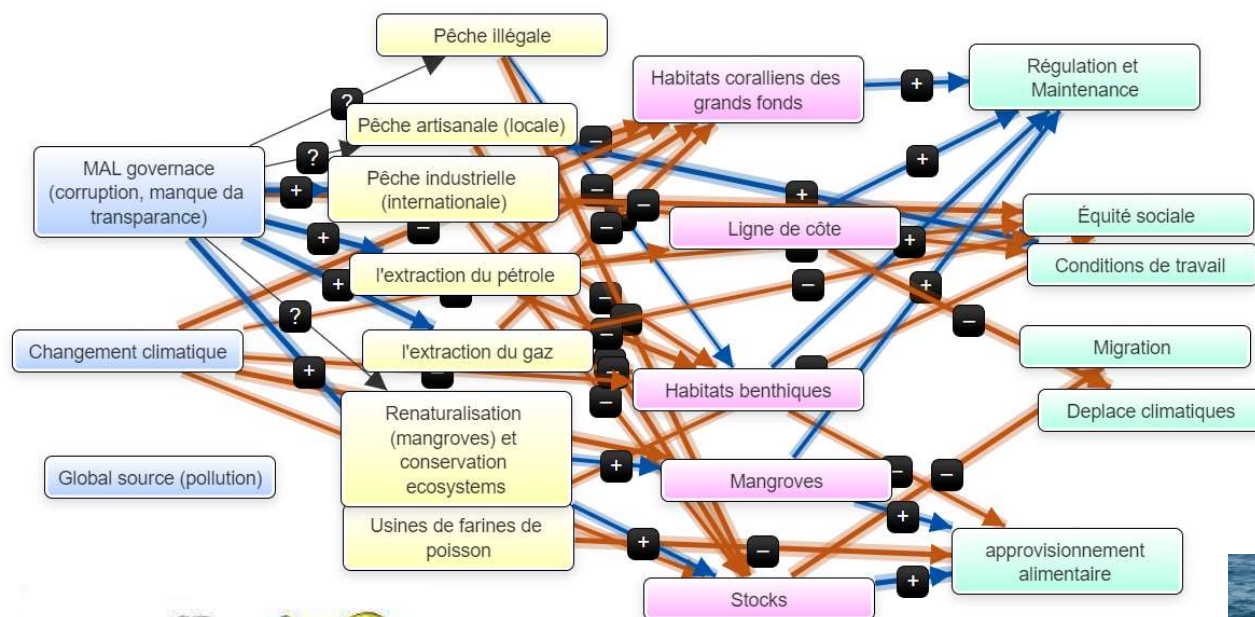
