Marine Science Communication in Europe: A way forward, EMB Future Science Brief 8, June 2022

The EMB Future Science Brief on Marine Science Communication was written by a group of 14 members of the EMB Communication Panel (EMBCP) between November 2019 and June 2022. The writing group was Chaired by Jan Seys (VLIZ, Belgium). The EMBCP is a permanent platform for marine science communicators from the EMB membership to promote EMB activities, synergise outreach activities and advocate for Ocean literacy.

The Future Science Brief was launched during a dedicated webinar on 23 June 2022 which discussed the challenges of communicating within the Ocean Decade and the EU Mission Ocean, and how to overcome these. The document and its recommendations were also presented as a keynote at the CommOCEAN 2022 conference marine science on communication in Sète. France. 30 November 2022.

The Future Science Brief has been used as a reference document for teaching and promoting science communication and Ocean literacy. It has also been highlighted at several events, which presented science communication challenges. In addition, the document was promoted among communication experts outside the marine science landscape.

The Future Science Brief has helped to promote the importance of (marine) science communication within research organisations, relevant funding organisations and national Ministries. It was also a source of inspiration and advice in the drafting of communication plans and strategic discussions on the future of communication departments. In particular, the request for information from the writing group on communication efforts to the National Research Council of Italy, highlighted some shortcomings and resulted in a working group to coordinate their science communication.
